

- Are you pregnant?
- Did you just give birth?
- Are you unable to care for your baby?
- Do you know someone struggling with these concerns?

The Maryland Safe Haven law allows a mother of an infant or responsible adult*, to leave an unharmed** infant, within 60 days of birth, at a designated facility without fear of arrest or prosecution.

Responsible adult means an individual 18 years old or older who
may reasonably be expected to provide proper care to an infant left
in the individual's care and who is willing and able to immediately
take the infant to a desianated facility.



^{**} Unharmed means no evidence of physical injury or failure to give proper care and attention to an infant.



In Maryland, designated facilities include hospitals, licensed medical providers, police departments, state police barracks, and insured fire companies (whether volunteer or professional).
