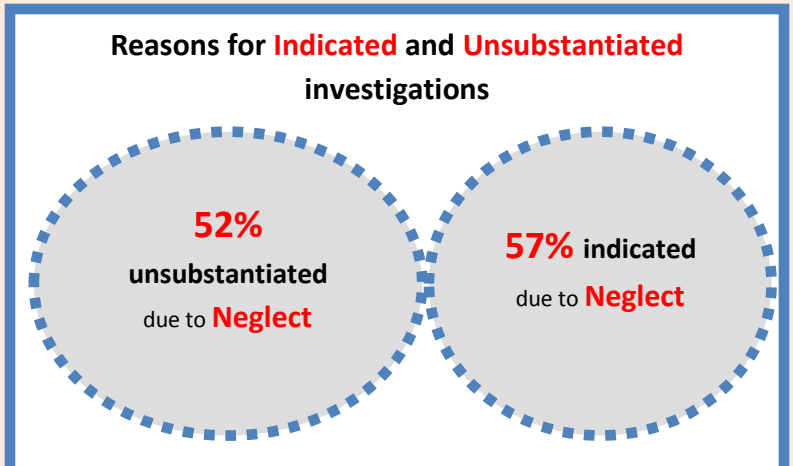

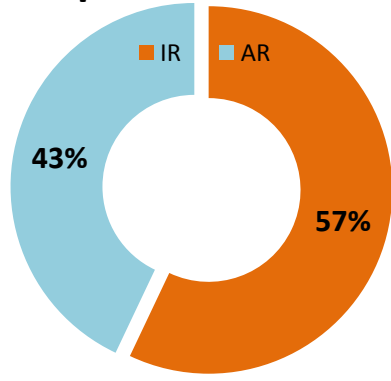

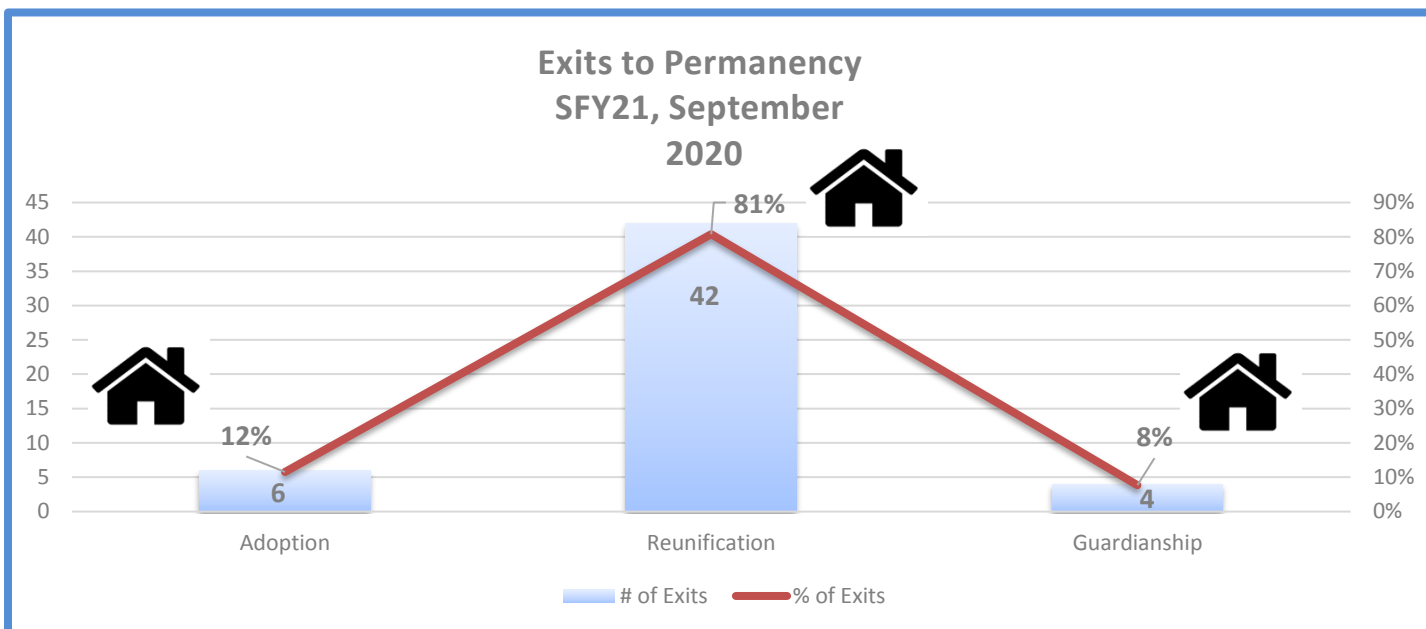

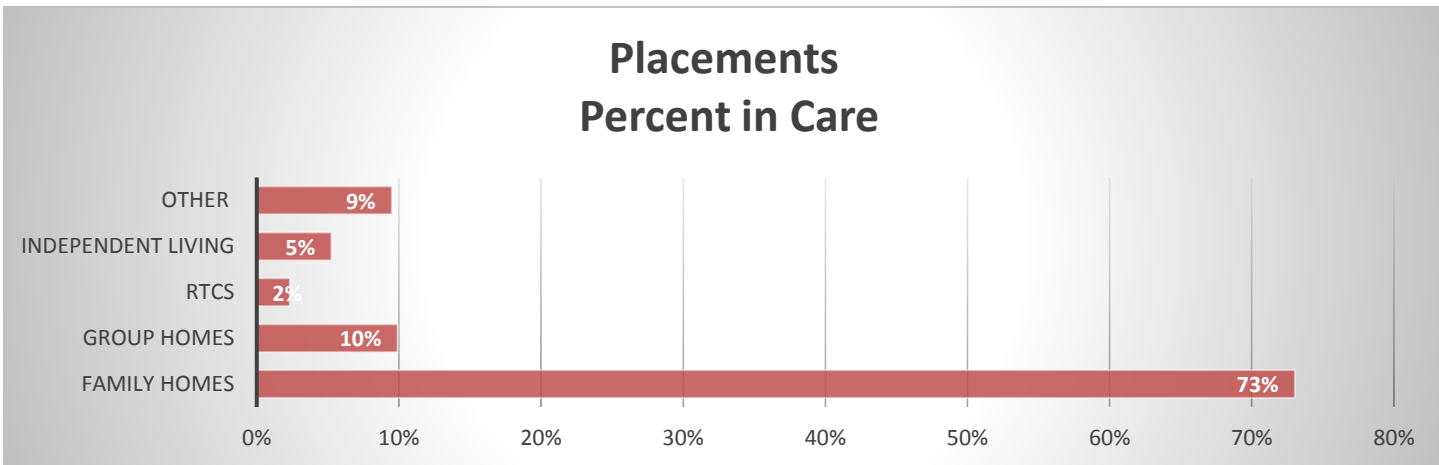
% of AR and IR cases September 2020



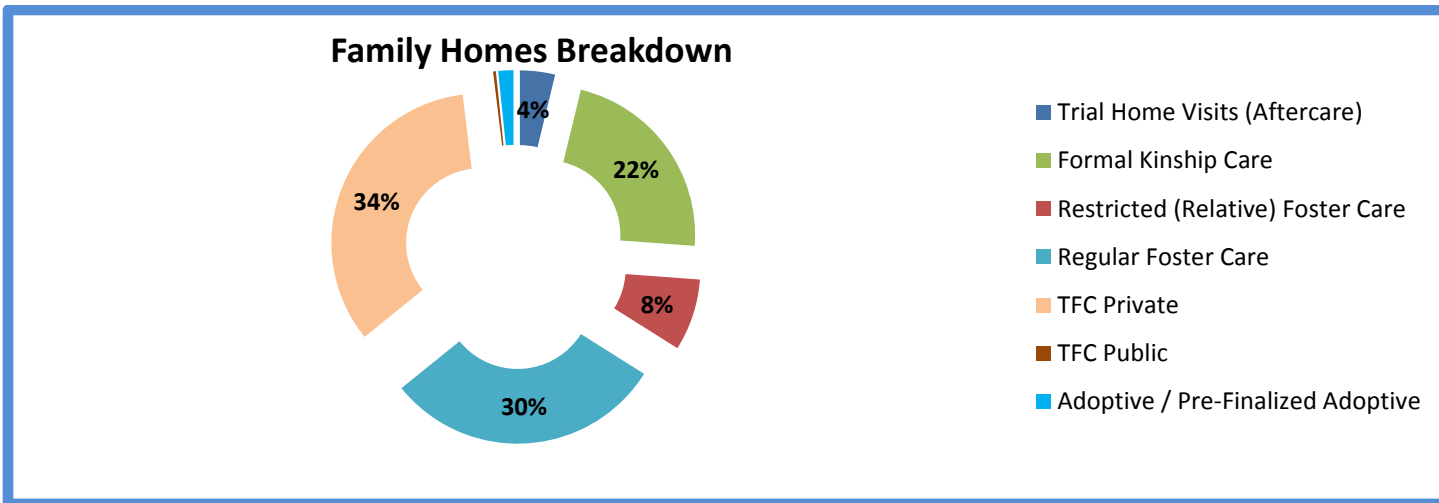

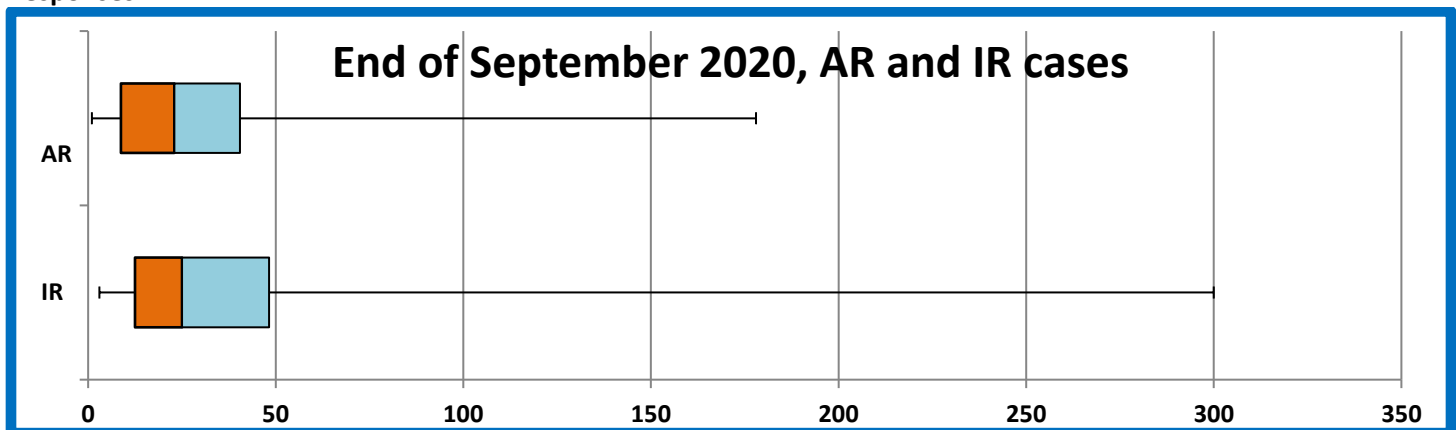

Responses



This chart displays the distribution of AR and IR cases for the end of September 2020 in Maryland. In the diagram, the middle "box" represents the middle 50% of values for the group. At the end of September, the counts of 50% of AR and IR were about 20 cases. The median value for AR and IR was about 20. The whiskers represent values outside the middle 50%. The max number of IR cases were about 68% more than AR cases. The size of the box for AR is smaller than IR, meaning the data for AR is more similar than the data for IR.
