## Tracked Legislation - 1996

HB18: Courts - Family Division - Establishment (LAMW)
Position: Support Status: Passed House Judiciary with
amendments; Unfavorable in Judicial Proceedings

This legislation would have established family court system in Maryland. The bill failed, but there is \$140,000 given to fund a pilot Family Court Project in Baltimore City. \*FYI: \$225,000 was given to Carroll, Frederick, Harford, Howard, and Washington Counties for Pro Se Project. \$20,000 given to Women's Law Center for Legal Forms Project.

HB39: Insurance - Unfair Trade Practices - Discrimination Based on Domestic Violence

Position: Support Status: Passed

This legislation mandates that life and health insurers cannot discriminate against a victim of domestic violence.

HB49: Family Law-Noncustodial Parent-Child Support Position: Monitor Status: Unfavorable in House Judiciary

HB64: Family Law - Child Support

HB67: Anti-Discrimination Act (LAMW)

HB77: Maryland Human Relations Commission - Aiding or Abetting Violation of Article (49B) - Retaliation <u>Position:</u> Support <u>Status:</u> No vote in Senate

HB194: Family Law-Support and Maintenance
Position: Support Status: Unfavorable in House Judiciary

HB297/SB215: Maryland Gun Violence Act of 1996 Position: Support Status: Passed

Limits handgun buyers to one purchase a month. Will also regulate private handgun transactions in the same manner as in-store purchases, including criminal background checks and waiting periods. Would prohibit sales to persons who have protective orders filed against them in civil court; would allow police responding to a domestic call to temporarily

remove guns from the house; makes it a specific offense to disarm police officer and creates a specific penalty for firing a gun from a motor car.

HB324: Child Support Enforcement - Legal Representation Position: Monitor Status: No vote in Judicial Proceedings

HB325: Employment Discrimination - Gender Identity (LAMW)

Position: Support Status: Unfavorable report in Commerce & Government Matters

HB334: Domestic Violence - Enforcement of Out-of-State Protective Orders

Position: Support Status: Passed

Requires that protective orders issued by courts of other states or Indian tribes be accorded full faith and credit by a court of this State and enforced as ordered of this State. Requires a law enforcement officer to arrest and take into custody a person whom the office has probable cause to believe is in violation of a protective order.

HB335: Domestic Violence - Penalties
Position: Support Status: Unfavorable report in House
Judiciary

HB336: Domestic Violence - Temporary Ex-Parte Orders and Protective Orders - Surrender of Firearms

Position: Support Status: Unfavorable in House Judiciary
Note: Provisions were included in the
Maryland Gun Violence Act of 1996 to confiscate
weapons in domestic violence cases and prevent
purchase of weapons when there is a protective order.

HB337: Family Law-Grounds for Absolute Divorce-Constructive Desertion

Position: Support Status: Unfavorable in House Judiciary

HB391: Child Support Arrearage - Revocation & Denial of Professional License

<u>Position:</u> Support <u>Status:</u> Unfavorable in House Judiciary HB749/SB618: Crimes - Assault Laws - Revisions (LAMW) Position: Support Status: Passed

With the passage of this bill, the legislation divides assault into two degrees: second degree misdemeanor
