Maryland's Working Families

- 1,607,036 Maryland women work, making up 49% of the state workforce.
- 74,020 Marylanders gave birth between 2015 and 2016.
- In 77 percent of Maryland households with children, all parents work (981,989 households).
- 141,930 Maryland grandparents live with grandchildren who are under 18.
- 771,000 Marylanders serve as family caregivers.

Sexual Assault in Maryland

- An estimated 420,000 Maryland women, or 18.2% of the female population in the state, have experienced rape in their lifetime. However, an estimated 22.3% of non-Hispanic black women in Maryland have experienced rape in their lifetime, compared to 18% of white women.
- Maryland women have a high lifetime prevalence of sexual violence other than rape, totaling an estimated number of 1,773,000 women, about 58.4% of the female population in the state.
- Approximately 391,000 Maryland women have experienced contact sexual violence by an intimate partner in their lifetime.

Maryland Women & Poverty

- 594,000 Marylanders (10%) live in poverty, a number greater than the population of Maryland's eleven smallest counties combined.
- Single-parent households headed by a female had a poverty rate of 26.1% in Maryland, compared to a rate of just 7.9% for all Maryland families.
- The annual cost of childcare in Maryland can exceed the cost of sending a child to college.
- The Maryland Family Network's Child Care Demographics 2013 report estimated that 79% of the state's children under 12 years old had mothers in the workforce, and the cost of childcare for one infant and one preschooler in most parts of the state exceeded \$1,000 a month.
- 9.9% of Maryland residents roughly 587,000 individuals are currently living without health insurance.

Domestic Violence in Maryland

CRIME RATE: In 2015, 30,534 Marylanders (including family members) were victims of domestic violence-related crimes; of these, 21,749 were intimate partners. 69% were women and 31% were men.

DEATHS: Between July 2015 and June 2016, 28 women, 3 children and 11 men in Maryland died as a result of domestic violence; 12 abusers committed suicide after actual or attempted murder and 1 abuser was killed by his victim in self-defense.
