

## LJ v. Massinga Reporting: Measure 68

**Date:** July 7, 2010 | **Revised:** 5/26/2020

#	Measure
68	99.8 percent of children in OHP were not housed outside regular business hours in an office, motel, hotel, or other unlicensed facility. If any child is so housed, BCDSS shall notify Plaintiffs' counsel within one working day of the reasons for the placement, the name of the child's CINA attorney, and the steps that BCDSS is taking to find an appropriate placement. Barring extraordinary circumstances, no child may be housed in an office for consecutive nights.

## Source/Criteria

- 1. According to the LJ Modified Consent Decree (MCD, 10/9/09), p. 25, Part Two
  - II.D.10. No child may be housed in an office, motel, hotel, or other unlicensed facility.
    - a. Definition:
      - (1) "Housed" means stays of four hours or longer.
- 2. For the purpose of this Measure, the parties agree that
- a. "overstay" means a stay outside of regular business hours of four hours or longer in an office, motel, hotel, or other unlicensed facility.
  - b. "working day" and "business day" have the same meaning.
  - c. "required notice" means that:
- i. Plaintiffs' counsel is notified within one business day of the reasons for the overstay, the name of the child's CINA attorney, and the steps that BCDSS is taking to find an appropriate placement.
- ii. If the overstay was for more than one consecutive night, the notice shall provide a description of the "extraordinary circumstances" that caused the consecutive night overstay.
- 3. This Exit Standard requires that two separate conditions be satisfied for any reporting period (a) 99.8 % of children in OHP not have an overstay; (b) for each incidence of an overstay for a child in OHP, the required notice to Plaintiffs' counsel be provided. Therefore, for the purposes of measurement and reporting, this Exit Standard is being divided into Part A and Part B calculations, both of which must be met for compliance with this Exit Standard.
