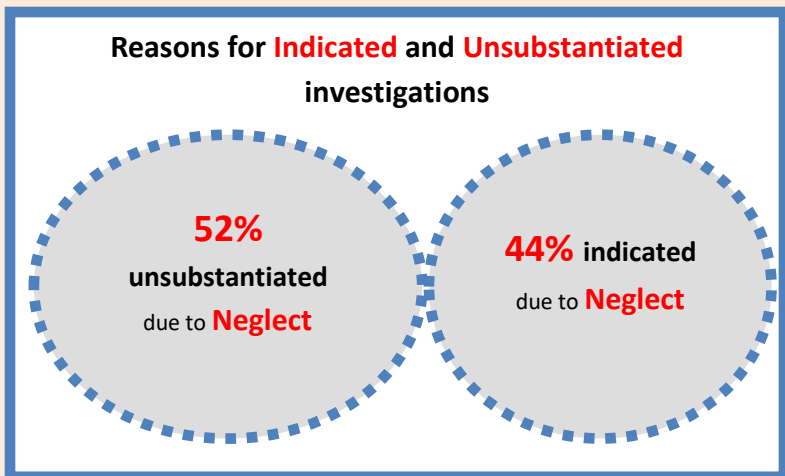

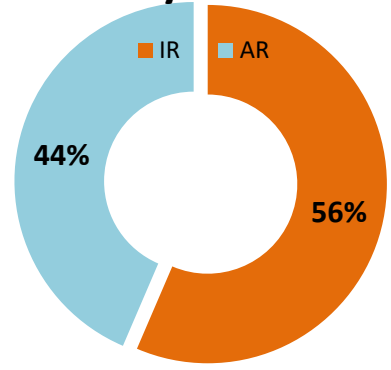

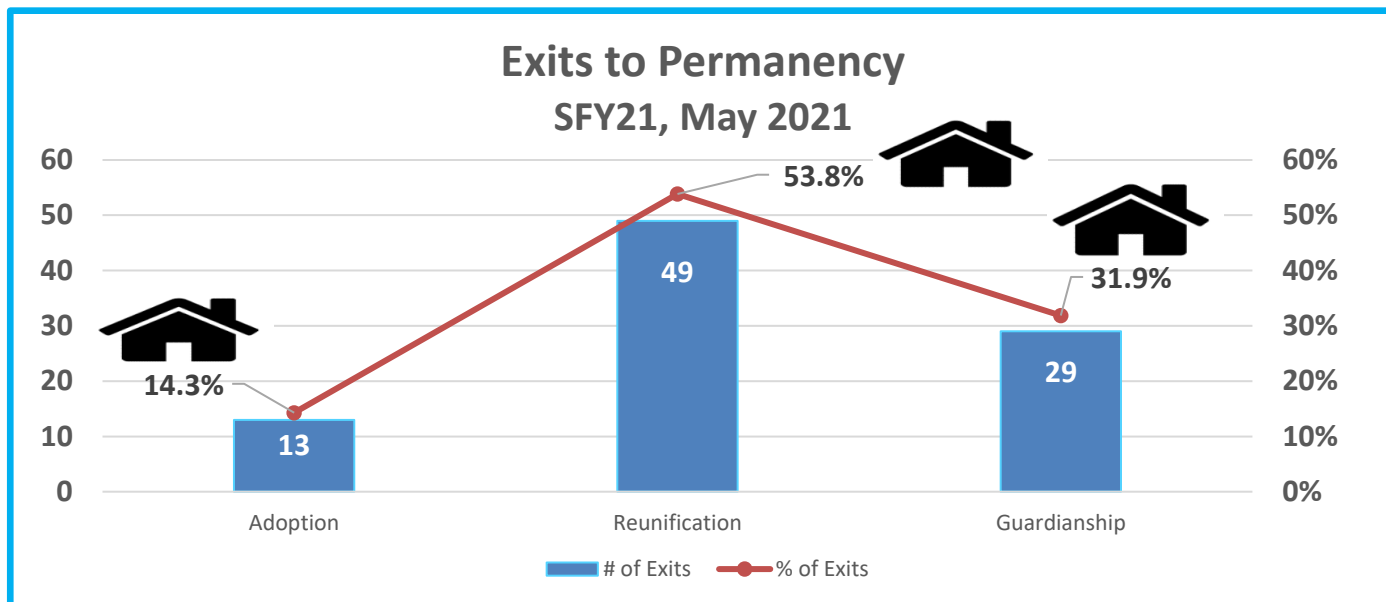

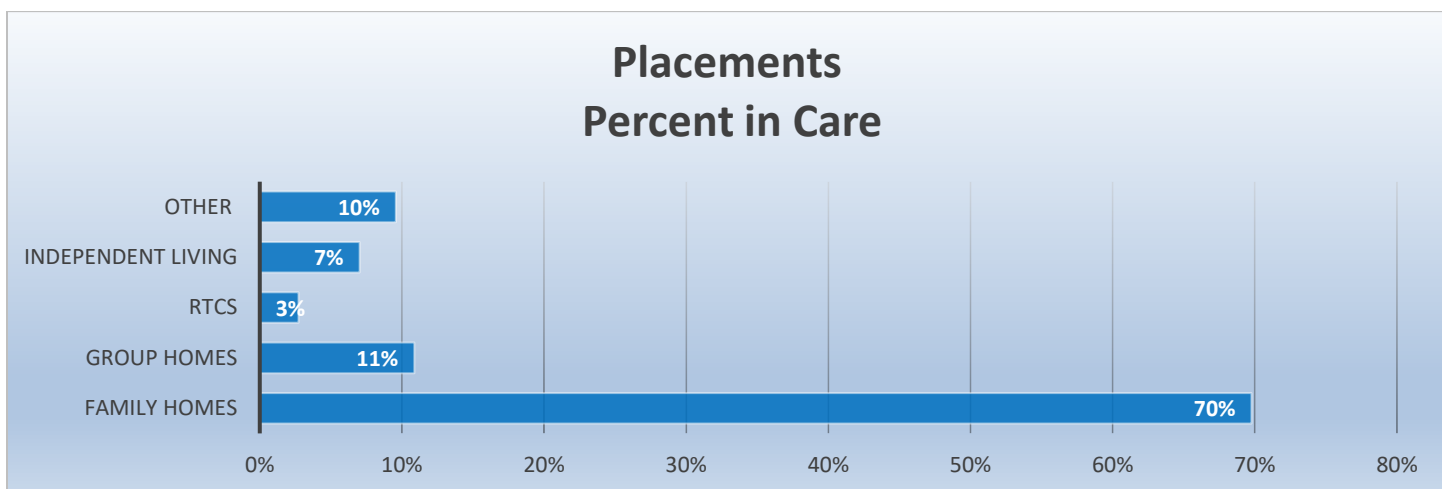
**% of AR and IR cases May 2021**



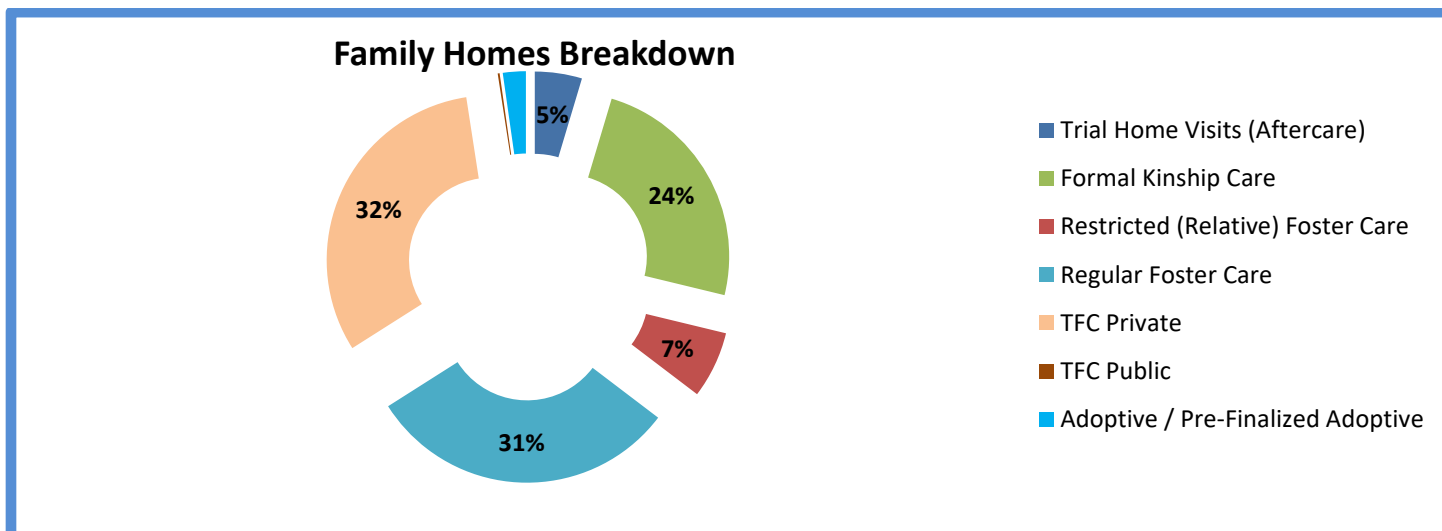

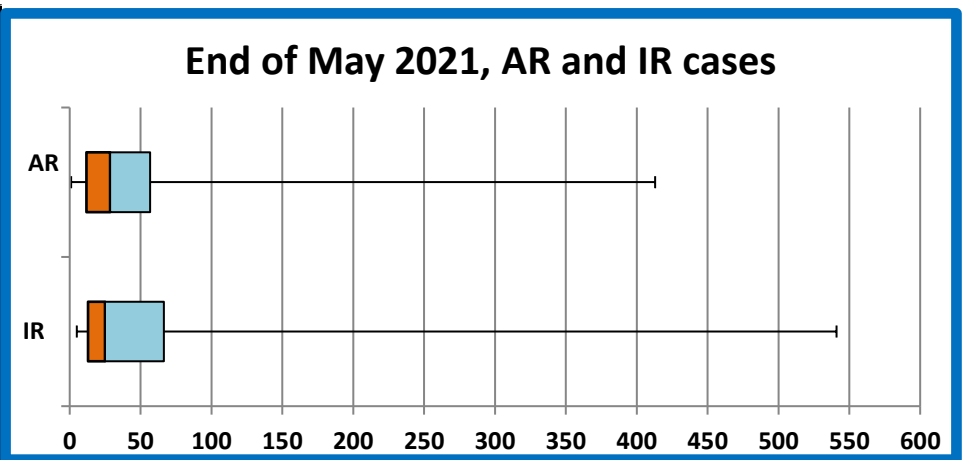

This chart displays the distribution of AR and IR cases for the end of May 2021 in Maryland. In the diagram, the middle “box” represents the middle 50% of the values. The median value for AR and IR were about 30. For both AR and IR, there was about five case change respectively from last month. The 3rd quartile represents 50% of AR and IR cases. The whiskers represent values outside the middle 50%, in which the top whisker was around 400 for IR and 300 for AR, respectively. The max number of IR cases vs AR cases is 32%. The size of the box for AR is smaller than IR, meaning the data for AR is more similar than the data for IR.
